

Actually the "I" in SPI stands for "incorporated" but maybe with our newest project, we should consider changing that to "international"! Recognizing SPI's significant Olympic single and multi-sport organizational experience, the U.S. Olympic Committee, in association with the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa (ANOCA), has retained SPI to assist the Botswana Africa Youth Games Organizing Committee (BAYGOC) and the Botswana National Olympic Committee with the organization and management of the 2014 Africa Youth Games (AYG). The AYG project is part of the USOC's long-standing cooperative support programs with fellow members of the world's Olympic Family.

The Africa Youth Games are modeled after the Youth Olympic Games, which was founded by the International Olympic Committee in Singapore in 2010 and focuses on engaging younger athletes in Olympic sport. The Games feature high-school-aged competitors, aged 14 to 18. For the AYG, over 2500 athletes representing all 54 countries of Africa, with an official delegation of up to 4000, will participate in 20 sports.

Hill Carrow is leading the AYG effort for SPI and was on site in Botswana last month. In a news release, Regina Vaka, Chairman of BAYGOC expressed sincere gratitude for the consulting arrangement and said that, "Mr. Carrow's input has been invaluable in preparing for the Games." The Africa Youth Games are one of four continental Youth Games-others are held in Asia, Australia, and Europe. The Games are scheduled for May 22-31, 2014 in Gaborone, capital city of Botswana.

New Facilities for Central Florida

SPI was selected in an RFP process by **Seminole County**, **Florida**, to perform a study that will help the county determine the feasibility and optimum configuration for a potential multifield baseball complex and additional fieldhouse facility. Seminole County currently has \$27 million dedicated to the project(s) and is looking to significantly expand economic impacts in the county from sports tourism.
